Alcea (Hollyhock) 'halo white'	perennial	pollinator friendly; a staple of the English Cottage garden
Alcea/Malva (Hollyhock) zebra 'mystic merlin'	perennial	pollinator friendly; a staple of the English Cottage garden
Alcea nigra (Black Hollyhock) 'watchman'	perennial	pollinator friendly; a staple of the English Cottage garden - pure black - a bit magical! And a great old fashioned dye plant.
Alchemilla (Lady's Mantle) 'moliis thriller'	perennial herb	A beautiful traditional herb garden plant. Leaves are stunning - and hold droplets of water like lotus!
Aloe vera	warm perennial	everyone should have one in their kitchen!
Ammi "Green Mist"	annual	a gorgeous additon to a bouquet - like a giant green Queen Anne's Lace!
Andrographis	annual herb	In Scandinavia this is now the main herb used to fight the common cold, flu, and upper respiratory infections. Clinical trials have shown that this herb really works and many believe that it is better than echinacea. Like echinacea, it works by boosting the immune system, helping the body to battle infections and to prevent them from reoccurring in the future. But it does more: it has adaptogen-like properties, it has anticancer activity, it is a bitter tonic, and it is an antioxidant that has been shown to protect the liver. In China and India the plant is commonly used to treat a wide range of infections such as gastrointestinal complaints, hepatitis, herpes, and throat infections. In short this is one amazing medicinal herb! Easy to grow annual and easy to use.
Angelica	herb	One of the largest and most stately of herbs. Stems are anise-flavored and can be candied. I grow mostly for its presence and for the benefit of the insects it draws. Likes a bit of shade.
Anise	herb	From whence you get anise seeds!
Anise Hyssop (Agastache)	perennial herb	An Agastache - the original more medicinal version. A great bee plant. We plant these all around our hives.
Aquilegia (Columbine) cameo mix	perennial	Great low-light plants for adding color. Soft and pleasant. This is a dwarf variety - 4-8" tall. Huge flowers cover the small plants.
Aquilegia (Columbine) maxi star	perennial	Great low-light plants for adding color. Soft and pleasant. Long Spurred Bright yellow flowers.

Aquilegia (Columbine) origami mix	perennial	Great low-light plants for adding color. Soft and pleasant. Largest columbine flowers - mix of bi-colors.
Aquilegia (Columbine) spring magic navy and white	perennial	Great low-light plants for adding color. Soft and pleasant. Dark grey-blue.
Arnica	perennial herb	Not for internal use - but absolutely fabulous for external uses.
Artemesia abrotanum (Southern Wood)	perennial herb	Such a wonderful, easy to grow, amazing smelling plant!
Artemesia annua 'sweet annie'	annual herb	Another great scent - can be a bit heavy. Cut and dry into wreaths and other arrangements for the house in winter. Just do so before it flowers! The pollen can be a bit too much! Spreads willingly.
Artemesia vulgaris or Mugwort	perennial herb	An intense member of the artemesia family - spreads very willingly. Not as strongly scented as the others listed here. A macro-biotic food staple.
Artemesia absinthium (wormwood)	perennial herb	Wonderful smelling - beautiful soft grey-green leaves. A must in the herb garden.
Artichoke, Imperial Star Hardy	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th. This is the shortest season artichoke available. Can be hard to get artichokes to maturity in this area. Worth trying though as the plants are beautiful. Plant in a protected spot - keep warm.
Arugula, cultivated	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd - Haven't tasted this variety yet - an original Italian strain.
Arugula, rocket	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd - very nice flavor that holds even once the flowers have started. We toss the flowers in salads - very pretty.
Arugula, Sylvetta (Wild)	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd - A more flavorful - hotter - arugula. Leaves are more dramatically lobed.
Asclepias incarnata - Red Swallowwort	perennial	Native bog plant, likes water - like milkweed, this is food plant for monarch butterfly caterpillars. This particularly has a pink vanilla-egg nog scented flower that you just can't get enough of!
Asclepias tuberosa - Butterfly Weed, Puerisy Root	perennial	Native bog plant, likes water - like milkweed, this is food plant for monarch butterfly caterpillars. Flowers are shades of yellow, orange and red
Aster, Sherbert Orange (annual)	annual	great cut flowers - quick growing. Good companions in vegetable garden.
Astragalus	perennial herb	A fundamental herb in Chinese medicine. Yellow flowers - very attractive. Roots can be harvested after about 3 years. "King of the tonic herbs", immunostimulant. Taprooted legume that is much easier to grow than many Chinese herbs. Prefers full sun, average soil, good drainage. Three-year-old roots used in soups as a medicinal food.
Bacopa (medicinal) - Bacopa monniera	herb	very limited number available this year. (Brahmi; Thyme-leaved gratiola) Improves mental clarity and memory! Improves mental clarity and memory! This is the true medicinal bacopa, not to be confused with the flowering bacopa (Sutera) commonly grown in hanging baskets. The whole plant is a nerve and cardiac tonic with a tranquilizing action similar to resperine. In India it is a dependable remedy for the treatment of debility, nervous breakdown, epilepsy, hysteria, and insanity. The juice of the fresh leaves is given to children for catarrh, bronchitis and diarrhea, or in cases of acute bronchitis and other coughs, a poultice made of boiled herb is applied to the chest. Also used as a diuretic and to treat rheumatism. Bacopa is a fast growing succulent annual creeping herb found in wet places throughout the Indian subcontinent. Easy to grow in pots or outdoors as a summer annual.
Baptistia (Indigo) Prairie Blues Solar Flare	shrub	very early flowering; great as cut flowers. A quick growing shrub. Flowers are bronzy with a soft pea-like style.
Basil 'african blue'	perennial herb	A non-seed forming "perennial" basil - short lived though - You must take cuttings and regrow plants to continue harvesting this delicious basil.
Basil 'aristotle'	herb	Very small leaves - makes a topiary-like round ball of basil.
Basil 'large leaf'	annual herb	strong, traditional basil flavor.
Basil 'lettuce Leaf'	annual herb	I love this flavor - no heat in it at all. I love pesto made from this variety. Large tender leaves favored for pesto; excellent for a wide variety of dishes. Best for freezing.
Basil 'sweet genovese'	annual herb	strong, traditional basil flavor
Basil ocimum x citrodorum 'pesto perpetuo'	perennial herb	A non-seed forming "perennial" basil - short lived though - You must take cuttings and regrow plants to continue harvesting this delicious basil. Strong flavor and variegated leaves make this a sort-after basil.
Basil, Amethyst Improved	annual herb	I haven't grown this before, but looks very beautiful.

Basil, Anise	annual herb	anise flavor
Basil, Cinnamon	annual herb	cinnamon flavor
Basil, Finissimo Verde A Palla	annual herb	Small leaves - forms into a round globe of basil. Very civilized and elegant.
Basil, Lime	annual herb	Lemon and Lime basil have a lot of the principles of Holy Basil. See Tulsii for Holy Basil varieties.
Basil, Magical Michael	annual herb	A clumping basil full of tasty flowers and leaves of green and purple. Compact, lush green foliage is beautifully decorated with numerous purple button-sized flowers. Terrific for containers and garden plantings.
Basil, Purple Ruffles	annual herb	Dark, black-blue leaves. Very attractive.
Basil, Queen of Sheba Thai	annual herb	A solid Thai flavor.
Basil, Red Rubin	annual herb	Red-purple leaves. Beautiful and dramatic.
Basil, Sweet Dani Lemon	annual herb	Lemon and Lime basil have a lot of the principles of Holy Basil. See Tulsii for Holy Basil varieties.
Basil, Sweet Thai	annual herb	A solid Thai flavor.
Bay Laurel (Laurus nobilis)	perennial herb	a limited number available in 2011. Like wine, thyme and leeks, bay leaf is a foundation flavour of French cuisine. Meat, fish and poultry dishes almost always have a touch. Frost-sensitive small trees; best grown in tubs that afford easy movement indoors during winter. Note: Bay seeds will not germinate if they dry out too much in storage.
Bean, Borlotto Bean Lingua di Fuoco	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th. Flat pod spotted in cranberry color over cream. Can be eaten as fresh pods as well as shelled beans.
Bells of Ireland	annual	green spikes - great for cutting.
Bloodroot (Sanguinaria canadensis)	perennial herb	a limited number available in 2011; shade. One of our most beautiful woodland wildflowers. Conspicuous white flowers, 5cm/2" across, appear in early spring. Important dyeplant: roots yield red-orange colour for dyeing wool. Indians dyed their bodies and clothes with bloodroot.
Borage (blue)	annual herb	edible flowers - light cucumber flavor. Leaves are spiny, but are also nice to add to early salads.
Borage (white)	annual herb	like the blue - but elegantly white ... very pretty mixed in with the brassicas and cucumber plants.
Boxwood (Buxus sempervirens)	scrub	Evergreen shrub. Formerly used to treat malaria, but no longer commonly used because excess doses can be poisonous. Very attractive hedging and topiary plant, frequently used in formal knot gardens. Winter mulching recommended. Use fresh or dried in wreaths.
Broccoli, Arcadia F1	vegetable / cold hardy	available April 22nd. A solid producing hybrid.
Broccoli, Calabrese Green Sprouting (Heirloom, Calabrese)	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Broccoli, Di Cicco (Heirloom, Calabrese)	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd. A rich-tasting old Italian heirloom. Compact 2-3' light-green plants. 3-4" bluish-green central head, then lots of medium-sized side shoots. Matures over a long period-best for home gardens.
Broccoli, Gypsy F1	vegetable / cold hardy	available April 22nd. A solid producing hybrid.
Broccoli, Romanesca (Heirloom, Calabrese)	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd. A unique type. Large compact cauliflower-type plant bears beautiful spiraling apple-green heads up to 6". Extremely soft texture and magnificent flavor. Snap off individual spears. Does well in North.
Brussels Sprouts, Falstaff Purple	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd. A beautiful garden plant - Ornamental purple strain; tall plants with sprouts the color of red cabbage, as tasty as green sprouts with a milder, nuttier flavor. Color intensifies after a hard frost, and color is retained when cooked.
Brussels Sprouts, green	vegetable / cold hardy	available April 22nd. A nice sweet brussels sprout. September harvest.
Buddleia royal red - Butterfly Bush	scrub	Just draws butterflies in droves...
Bugle 'black scallop'	perennial herb	a lawn herb - these can compete with grass, and add color and texture to the lawn. Bee-friendly.
Burdock Root, 'chiko' (gobo)	root vegetable	very nutritious root vegetable.

Burdock Root, 'takingawa' (gobo)	root vegetable	very nutritious root vegetable.
Cabbage, Copenhagen Market (green)	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd. An early or main season variety. 63-100 days from transplant. A Danish heirloom introduced by H. Hartman & Company in 1909, and the standard of excellence since then. Solid heads reach 6-8" in diameter, weigh 3-4 pounds, and resist splitting. Medium-sized plants are ideal for small gardens. Makes delicious coleslaw, salad or sauerkraut. Does well in a range of climates and stores well also.
Cabbage, Deacon Red Savoy	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Cabbage, Red Express	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd. An early harvesting red cabbage.
Cabbage, Super Red	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Cabbage, Tendersweet Green	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Cabbage, Winterfurst Green Savoy	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Calaminta, Varigated	perennial herb	Easy to grow herb garden staple.
Calendula 'resina'	annual herb	self-seeds. A great companion plant - I srinkle the seeds throughout the garden. Edible flowers. Dry flowers by breaking open the centers. Great for making salves and feeding chicks.
Canna 'miss oklahoma' (watermelon pink)	perennial	Fun. Pure opulence.
Caper Bush	tender scrub	very limited number available in 2011; must be kept above freezing.
Cardamom	perennial herb	very limited number available in 2011; must be kept above freezing.
Cardinal Flower - lobelia	perennial	native - tall spires of red. Hummingbirds adore it.
Cardoon (Artichoke)	tender perennial	Hardy perennial, a silver spiny variety comparable to the variety Argentée de Plainpalais, but with less thorns.
Carnation (Dianthus) 'grenadin snow white'	perennial	unlike the ones at the florist, these still smell like carnations!
Carnation (Dianthus) Giant Chabaud Orange Sherbet	perennial	unlike the ones at the florist, these still smell like carnations!
Carrot, Nantes di Chioggia	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Castor Bean	annual	A triumphant and gigantic plant! Star-shaped leaves can be over a foot in diameter and it can grow over 10 feet tall in one season. Thick, bright, cold, magenta stems!
Cat grass / oats	annual	
Catnip	perennial herb	Easy to grow herb garden staple.
Catnip 'walker's low'	perennial	not that attractive to cats - this is mainly ornamental. Easy to grow - nothingbothers it - beautiful mounds of purple-blue flowers on grey-green leaves.
Cauliflower, early snowball	vegetable / cold hardy	available April 22nd
Cauliflower, Purple Cape	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd; purple!
Celandine	perennial herb	a necessity in an apothecary garden. Its bright orange sap is known to cure warts and other skin problems. A soft and pretty plant - can spread in the right conditions. Likes a bit of shade.
Celeriac	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd. This type of celery is grown for its root - 3 to 5" across, round, white, with a mild nutty flavor. Try it in potato salad, hot dishes, soup or shred for salads. Needs long steady growth with even temperatures and moisture as well as high fertility. Roots can be stored like carrots
Celery, Chinese	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd - Very rare - Hotter than the European celery varieties.
Celery, Golden - Dorato di Asti	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd. Easy to grow early variety. Dwarf, with yellow foliage, cream-colored stalks of fine flavor with thick heavy stringless 9" ribs. Extra-large nutty tasting base. Disease resistant. No blanching or trenching needed.
Celery, John Jeavons' Special Strain	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd. From John Jeavons' research garden, developed from the Ventura variety. Tall Utah type with upright glossy bright-green stalks over a foot long. Well-developed hearts on high-yielding plants. Good disease resistance and slow to bolt.

Celery, Red Adventure	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Celery, Sedano di Monte - Wild Celery (The Italian Lovage)	perennial herb	available starting April 22nd. One of the earliest greens coming up in Spring.
Celery, Utah tall	vegetable / cold hardy	available April 22nd. A solid variety - celery needs a lot of watering.
Chamomile, Bodegold Strong German	perennial herb	An intense variety of German Chamomile. Improved strain of German chamomile for commercial production. Erect, sturdy growth habit and larger flowers containing up 0.7% essential oil high in bisabolol and other medicinal compounds.
Chamomile, Dyer's or St. Johns	perennial herb	Flowers are bright golden yellow - centers as well as petals. An important Dye plant and a pleasure to grow.
Chamomile, German	perennial herb	Biodynamic herb - I use this Camomile in a tea as a foliar spray for seedlings - prevents damping off. Also makes a great bee-tea for feeding honey bees in periods where pollen is scarce.
Chamomile, Roman	perennial herb	Forms a soil-holding mat of aromatic foliage--good understory with other perennials.
Chervil	annual herb	A mild flowery version of parsley - I couldn't live without this in Spring.
Chickweed (Stellaria media)	annual herb / green	Self seeding. Very early green. Beautiful and tasty salad addition. And a great fodder plant for chickens and chicks.
Chicory, Biondo (Golden) Grumolo	vegetable / cold hardy	Can come back the second year.
Chicory, Catalogna Brindisina	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd - This actually one of three new chicories this year - that are Punctarellas. The leaves are pulled off the mature plant, revealing a tight bulb made of light colored mild tasting sprouts. These are use to make a wide assortment of raw and lightly sauted dishes.
Chicory, Catalogna Frantagliate Grumolo	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Chicory, Catalogna Puntarelle	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd - This actually one of three new chicories this year - that are Punctarellas. The leaves are pulled off the mature plant, revealing a tight bulb made of light colored mild tasting sprouts. These are use to make a wide assortment of raw and lightly sauted dishes.
Chicory, Galantina - Asparagus Chicory	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd - This actually one of three new chicories this year - that are Punctarellas. The leaves are pulled off the mature plant, revealing a tight bulb made of light colored mild tasting sprouts. These are use to make a wide assortment of raw and lightly sauted dishes.
Chicory, Italiko Rosso (Red-Ribbed Dandelion)	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Chicory, Red Grumolo	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Chicory, Rossa di verona "Aida"	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Chicory, Verde Grumolo	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Chicory, White-Ribbed Dandelion style	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Chives, common purple	perennial herb	a staple of a dooryard herb garden
Chives, Garlic	perennial herb	Wonderful version of chives - large star-like flowers - white. Flowers are edible and tangy in salads.
Chives, Grolau	perennial herb	haven't grown this before - can't wait to taste it! (Windowsill chives) Swiss strain developed for greenhouse forcing. Excellent, strong flavour and thick, dark green leaves. Suitable for indoor culture; less susceptible to turn yellow or leggy. Produces best when cut continuously.
Chives, Kobold Garlic	perennial herb	haven't grown this before - can't wait to taste it! Kobold is a more compact, more uniform variety of garlic chives. White flowers. Ht. 30cm/1ft.
Chives, Ping Giant	perennial herb	Broad, flat leaved chive. Great flavor. Sweet.
Chives, Staro	perennial herb	haven't grown this before - can't wait to taste it! All purpose high yielding variety for the processing, fresh-cut, forcing, and potplant markets. Leaves are extra thick and dark green.
Choy Sum Red Stem Asian budding green	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Cicely, Sweet	perennial herb	Likes a bit of shade. Sugar saver. Sweet, anise-scented leaves and stalks (fresh or dried) add delightful flavour to sweets and desserts, saving about half the sugar. Of particular interest to diabetics.
Cilantro, delfino fine leaf	annual herb	A fine leafed - not a lot of flavor, but very pretty.

Cilantro, mexican	annual herb	A spiny, heat-loving cilantro. (Culantro; Thorny coriander; Ngo gai) Native to Central America, but now cultivated throughout Southeast Asia and Latin America. Favoured where the true coriander (<i>Coriandrum sativum</i>) does not do well because it can stand hot, steamy weather. Leaves are tough, but if sliced and then chopped they are quite tasty. Unlike other corianders, this variety dries well, retaining good colour and flavour, and it can stand some cooking -- properties that may become significant to the dried spice market.
Cilantro, Papalo (<i>Porophyllum ruderale</i>)	annual herb	One of my favorite plants - soft, pea-like leaves with scent glands that emit puffs of cilantro scent into the air as you brush past. Loves heat. When it's too hot for cilantro, you can use papalo. Seeds are very volatile though - so I never know how many plants I'll actually have available. Also called Quelite or Quilquina, the leaves of this plant from Central America are used for flavoring in guacamole, tacos, stews or salsa, or eaten raw in salads. The flavor is distinctive and pungent and is often compared to arugula and cilantro with citrus.
Cilantro, Santo	annual herb	This is the traditional tasty cilantro/coriander. It does bolt in heat.
Clematis integrifolia 'mongolian bells'	perennial vine	I love these understated, subtle clematis. The big flowered ones are opulent, but there's something just so lovely about these frilly silky-tendrilled vines with the small dark purple bells.
Clematis paniculata 'sweet autumn'	perennial vine	This is another understated, subtle clematis. Covers itself with tiny white flowers in late summer, early fall. Takes a year or two to get itself established.
Cleome - Sparkler Blush	annual	A great garden companion; bees love it.
Clover, Crimson	annual / spreader	a tall (12") clover - grow along fences, etc. Bumbles love it.

Pepper, General - we're planning 44 different varieties of Hot and Sweet peppers this year!		
Pepper, HOT, Aji Dulce (mild!)	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Look just like a Red Habanero, but has little or no heat. This variety is popular in Latin American countries, because the pretty 2 in. long red peppers offer the same strong aromatic essence and flavor that is found in Habanero, with only a hint of heat. Tall plants produce an abundant harvest of tasty fruits.
Pepper, HOT, Ancho (pablano style)	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Dark green peppers mature to almost brown and are 5 inches long and 2-1/2 inches wide with a slight taper and blunt end. These are a little longer and milder than Ancho 101, with Scoville units from 600 to 1,800. These peppers are called Poblano when fresh and Ancho when dried.
Pepper, HOT, Ancho 101 (Pablano-style)	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; When fresh and still green, these mildly hot, heart-shaped peppers are stuffed and made into chiles rellenos. When mature they are dark, rust red, richly flavored, and often dried and ground into chili powder. Peppers become 4 inches long, tapering to a blunt point. Wrinkled skin takes on even more character when dried. May be strung into long ropes or made into wreaths.
Pepper, HOT, Ancho Gigantia	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; another type of Poblano/Ancho pepper. Dark green/mild heat.
Pepper, HOT, Ancho Ranchero f1	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; another type of Poblano/Ancho pepper. Dark green/mild heat.
Pepper, HOT, Ancho San Luis	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; High quality, uniform heart-shaped peppers are dark green, maturing to red, then mahogany. Mildly pungent peppers, 1,500 to 4,500 Scoville units, are 6 inches long and 3 inches wide. They are used fresh, but are also excellent for drying because the fruit is so uniform in size and shape.
Pepper, HOT, Fish	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Very unusual and ornamental pepper plant is variegated both on the foliage and the peppers themselves. Both leaves and fruit are striped with creamy white and green, with the peppers eventually turning orange-red. Very hot fruit, 1 to 2 in. long, was used to season fish and shellfish in the African-American communities around Baltimore and Philadelphia back in the 1930's and 1940's. Plants are attractive enough just to be used as ornamentals, but peppers are prized for use in cooking.
Pepper, HOT, Habanero (orange, traditional)	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; A blistering hot pepper 40 times hotter than Jalapeno! Among the most potent ones we sell. Wrinkled fruit is 1 inch long and 1-1/2 inches wide, with a tapered end. Peppers begin as light green then turn to golden-orange and are loaded onto 36 inch tall plants. Thrives best in warm southern climates.
Pepper, HOT, Holy Molé	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; The first hybrid pasilla pepper, which is best known for its distinctive nutty and spicy flavor in mole sauce. 7 to 9-inch long peppers start out green then mature to a dark chocolate color. They may be used fresh or dried, adding rich, smoky flavor but very little heat to dishes. High-yielding plants are resistant to 2 types of pepper virus.
Pepper, HOT, jalapeno	vegetable, Warm weather	available May 13th; Fiery, thick-walled peppers grow 3 in. long and 1-1/2 inches wide, with rounded tips. Dark green at first, then turning red. Good for fresh use or pickling; famous for nachos and other Tex-Mex dishes.
Pepper, HOT, Jamaican Hot Chocolate	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; These shiny, habanero-type peppers are deep chocolate-brown when ripe and ribbed or wrinkled, resembling large dates or prunes. Fruits are 1-1/2 to 2 inches long and with an extremely hot Caribbean flavor that is strong and smoky. Those in the know say that Jamaican Hot Chocolate makes a great hot sauce. This strain originated from a pepper found in a market in Port Antonio, Jamaica.
Pepper, HOT, Joe's Long Cayenne	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th. It is an heirloom that came over from Italy with the Sestito family. All of the sweet full flavor of the Jimmy Nardello, but it is also hot. While it is a cayenne type, it is less hot than a standard cayenne, about as hot as a hot jalapeno. These beautiful rich red peppers are a perfect choice for stringing and hanging in the kitchen, since they dry so well.

Pepper, HOT, Kung Pao	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Wonderful new Oriental hot peppers just right for making Kung Pao Chicken or the Asian stir-fried dishes. The tall plants are quite a sight when they become absolutely loaded with 4.5-inch long, slightly curved skinny peppers that mature from green to a brilliant red. They are thin-walled for easy drying, or may be used fresh for adding inviting flavor to a dish. Peppers have about 10,000 Scoville units, so should be eaten with care.
Pepper, HOT, longslim cayenne	vegetable, Warm weather	available May 13th; Bountiful harvest of pencil-shaped fruits that are 5 inches long and 1/2 inch thick, but often curled and twisted. Flavor is red hot and best used in very hot dishes. Easily dried.
Pepper, HOT, Numex Big Jim	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; The largest of New Mexican varieties, this pepper has pods up to 12 inches long that weigh as much as 4 ounces. Their size makes them a favorite for chiles rellenos. Medium hot pungency. As an advantage, plants are able to set fruit under hot, dry conditions.
Pepper, HOT, Numex Española	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Plant produces good yields of hot 4" long by 1 1/4" wide hot peppers. Peppers turn from green to red when mature.
Pepper, HOT, Numex Sauve Orange (mild)	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Developed by the Chile Pepper Institute, this pepper has all the wonderful flavor of a habanero but with very little heat, only about 800 Scoville Units. The distinctive habanero citrus-like aroma and flavor remains and many people can enjoy it better without the searing heat of a regular habanero. The word "suave" means smooth or mild in Spanish, and that is descriptive of the mellow flavor this variety delivers. Tall plants typically produce about 100 peppers each.
Pepper, HOT, Pimiento de padron (mild)	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; This pepper from Spain is traditionally used in its immature green stage, when it is picked quite small and fried in olive oil and served as an appetizer called a 'tapa.' When harvested small and green, peppers are mild, but get hotter as they grow. At full maturity, they are about 2 1/2 in. long and 1 1/4 in. wide, deep red and fiery hot.
Pepper, HOT, Purple Jalapeño	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; The fruit of this jalapeno turns dark purple and stays that way for a long time before finally ripening to red. Peppers are somewhat larger than regular jalapeno, but with the same thick walls and fiery heat. Great for use in salsas and would be very attractive pickled with a mixture of other jalapeno colors.
Pepper, HOT, Scotch Bonnet	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; A Capsicum chinese very similar to Habanero, but later in maturity with fruit that is not quite as long. Tall, vigorous plants bear peppers that begin as green, but mature to red. Fruity aroma and same blistering heat as the Habanero.
Pepper, HOT, Serrano	vegetable, Warm weather	available May 13th; Very hot chile called for in many recipes. Candle-flame shaped fruit are 2-1/4 inches long, green, then red at full maturity. Borne on attractive 30 to 36 inch erect, branching plants. Suitable for salsas and sauce recipes as well as eating fresh. Vigorous bearer.
Pepper, HOT, Tabasco	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Fiery hot, this is the one that has made Tabasco sauce famous. Green leaf strain that grows best in the South and East. Light yellow-green peppers turn to red and grow on tall plants.
Pepper, HOT, Trinidad perfume	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; This wonderful seasoning pepper from Trinidad may look like a typical habanero, but it has no heat. What it does have is delectable pepper flavor that adds so much to make Caribbean dishes or other cuisines really special. Pendant peppers are 1 to 1 1/2 inches long and mature to golden orange-yellow. Plants are tall and extremely prolific.
Pepper, HOT, White habanero	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; These creamy white peppers are smaller than the typical habanero, only about 1 1/2 inches long and 1/2 inch across, but with the same habanero heat and distinctive fruity flavor. Expect abundant harvests of these very hot peppers.
Pepper, HOT, Yellow mushroom	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; So named because of its shape resembling a mushroom, it is also sometimes known as a squash pepper for its resemblance to a patty-pan squash. Maturing to light yellow, then finally to golden, this is an extremely hot fruit. Abundant harvests of these thin-skinned, 2 inch peppers, which are especially good pickled.
Pepper, SWEET, better bell peppers	vegetable, Warm weather	available May 13th; Even blockier, thicker walled and earlier than the original. Four-lobed peppers mature from green to bright red. Vigorous variety maintains its large fruit size and production throughout a long season. Tobacco mosaic virus resistant.
Pepper, Sweet, Bridge to Paris	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Elegant, large, long sweet peppers.
Pepper, SWEET, Chocolate	vegetable, Warm weather	available May 13th; Early small-sized bell pepper. Ripens from green to chocolate-red on the outside and brick red inside. Thick sweet flesh.

Pepper, SWEET, Corno di Toro Rosso	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th. Huge heirloom Italian sweet pepper, with long, curved fruits that do look like a bull's horn. May be the longest stuffing pepper at 6-10" long and up to 2" diameter. Red when ripe. Excellent flavor. Prized for salads, grilling or sautéing.
Pepper, SWEET, Cubanelle	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Yellow-green, frying type pepper. Six inch long fruits have thin walls and waxy flesh. Excellent split and fried in olive oil.
Pepper, Sweet, Doe Hill	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Early, huge yields of small- to medium-sized sweet and tangy fruits. It has all the sweetness and pizzazz of other golden bell varieties without the finickiness and the long waits. It yields huge quantities of peppers on each plant, which is relatively compact, growing to about 3 feet in height.
Pepper, SWEET, Flexum hybrid	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; A funny name for a terrific pepper. Beautiful, 4 oz. cone-shaped peppers start out ivory then mature to yellow, orange, and finally red. They become about 6 in. long and are thick-walled and very sweet. Abundant fruit sets upright on the compact plants, making peppers easy to pick.
Pepper, SWEET, golden california wonder bell pepper	vegetable, Warm weather	available May 13th; Golden-yellow at full maturity, these peppers are thick-walled, meaty and really sweet and tasty. Square shaped fruits are about 4 inches long and wide, and grow upright on healthy, plants, making harvesting easy. Expect great production and beautiful, very sweet tasting peppers, perfect for enjoying fresh, cooked, or stuffed.
Pepper, SWEET, Golden Marconi	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Golden-yellow Italian sweet peppers are 3-lobed and up to 1 foot long. Traditionally used for frying, but also sweet and delicious when eaten fresh. Tremendous yields of clear golden, high-quality fruit.
Pepper, SWEET, Gypsy	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Outstanding yield, good looks and flavor combine with earliness to make this pepper a winner. Wedge-shaped fruit is 3 to 5 inches long, pale yellow at first, maturing to orange-red; very sweet when ripe. Plants have continuous pendant fruiting habit and perform well in both hot and cool regions.
Pepper, SWEET, Mellow Star	vegetable, Warm weather	available May 13th; heavily wrinkled fruits are thin walled, mild (no heat) when green and slightly sweet when red. Popular in Japan where it is used in tempura. Also very good in stir fries or sautéing. In Asia, fruits are always cooked green but they also may be used red. Large, upright plants produce good yields over an extended harvest period.
Pepper, SWEET, Orange Sun	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Beautiful deep orange bell pepper is from 4 to 5 inches long and not quite as wide. Thick walls and very sweet flavor make this a wonderful addition to salads, stir-fries, or any use when gorgeous color and sweet taste are desired.
Pepper, SWEET, Pepperoncini	vegetable, Warm weather	available May 13th; The popular little, thin, pickling pepper. 3-5-inch fruit have a superb flavor and just a little heat. Small plants. This heirloom comes from southern Italy.
Pepper, SWEET, Pritavit hybrid	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Beautiful crimson red peppers are deliciously sweet with a very thick-walled crisp flesh. Deeply-ribbed, bell-shaped fruit is about 2 1/2 in. tall and 4 in. wide with a slightly flattened shape. This kind of pepper is known as a topepo type in Italy, where it is enjoyed for its rich sweet flavor and juicy red flesh. These are wonderful cut up in salads, stuffed with your favorite filling, or used in any dish that calls for sweet red pepper. Heavy-yielding plants mature early and are easy to grow.
Pepper, SWEET, red beauty bell	vegetable, Warm weather	available May 13th
Pepper, SWEET, Red Ruffled Pimiento	vegetable, Warm weather	available May 13th; also known as a Cheese Pepper.
Pepper, SWEET, Romanian	vegetable, Warm weather	available May 13th; Plant produces high yields of 4" long by 2" wide sweet peppers. Peppers turn from pale yellow to red when mature. Peppers have thick flesh and are very sweet. Excellent for frying or stuffing!
Pepper, SWEET/HOT, Pimiento de Padron	vegetable, Warm weather	available May 13th; Little sweet chili size peppers often fried whole. Horned shaped about the size of a habanero pepper they are an heirloom pepper of Spain and very relished there. Every 10th or so will be extremely hot making for a fun game of culinary roulette. If left to ripen red they will be quite spicy.
Perilla frutescens magilla - rainbow-colored shiso	annual - might self-seed	a kaleidoscope of color in each leaf. Fun and easy to grow.
Phaecelia	annual	A great bee plant and cover crop. Flowers are delicate purple in spirals...
Phlomis cashmeriana (Jerusalem Sage)	perennial	This is going to be my best year ever for these fabulous Phlomis - These have pink flowers.
Physostregia alba (Obedient Plant - white)	perennial	Beautiful clumps of white flowers glowing on dark green foliage.

Plantain, Giant Turkish	perennial herb	!!!! I haven't grown this before - but I'm very excited to see what they are like!
Plantain, narrow leaf	perennial herb	great for bee stings.
Plantain, wide leaf	perennial herb	great for bee stings. Can compete with grass in a lawn.
Plectranthis, Silver shield	perennial herb	tender - bring inside in winter - these plants like coming inside and thrive all winter! This one is pretty but doesn't have much scent.
Plectranthus, Cuban Oregano	perennial herb	tender - bring inside in winter - these plants like coming inside and thrive all winter! This one has a potent oregano or thyme like scent. Varigated large succulent leaves.
Plectranthus, Vick's Plant	perennial herb	tender - bring inside in winter - these plants like coming inside and thrive all winter! This one has a vibrant eucalytus - vicks's vapor rub - scent and has emerald green succulent leaves.
Poppy, Danish Flag	perennial	totally different - maybe over complex - poppies. Red and cream and yellow with green center.
Poppy, Imperial Pink	perennial	totally different - maybe over complex - poppies. All pink but tremedous texture.

Primula - Cowslip	perennial herb	one of the very first flowers in spring - and so pretty. Yellow, low to the ground. A long herbal history.
Primula 'japonica' mixed	perennial	Beautiful candleabras of color suspended over lareg romaine-lettuce like leaves. Plants around water - they like it moist and lightly shaded.
Primula noverna capitata 'deep blue'	perennial	A very cool primula - I like these planted in a pot thatsits in a deep dish for water retention on the picnic table. This year, I'm mixing them with gotu kola.
Primula vialli	tender perennial	For the primula collector - this is a bit sensitive to cold - zone 5 should be Ok... plan for a protected location.
Prunella 'bella blue'	perennial	A new ornamental version of Self-Heal. If you adore those absolutely amazing flowers that self heal produces, this will be even more fun - They are huge self heal bright blue flowers!
Prunella Grandiflora 'freelander blue'	perennial	Another ornamental prunella/self heal. As above - I had to try this one tocompare!
Pulmonaria (Lungwort, Bethlehem Sage) longifolia 'E.B.Anderson'	perennial	Well spotted leaves - blueish purple flowers
Pulmonaria (Lungwort, Bethlehem Sage) saccharata 'mrs. moon'	perennial	Well spotted leaves - pinkish purple flowers
Pulmonaria (Lungwort, Bethlehem Sage) saccharata 'sissinghurst white'	perennial	Well spotted leaves - elegant white flowers
Purslane, Erect Large-Leaf	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd - A green with Omega 3 Fatty Acids bioavailable to us humans! I like the erectness of this variety - the leaves stay nice and clean.
Purslane, French Wild	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd - the original purslane - a weed for some people, but a great plant to have around weed or not. This is a green with Omega 3 Fatty Acids bioavailable to us humans! Very delicious in salads. Not a good one to cook. I made a salad with purslane leaves and slices of papaya along with the peppery papaya seeds last year that was so wonderful!
Pussy Willow - Black	scrub	Always a treat in early spring!
Pyrethrum	perennial herb	A natural insecticide - can be strong. I don't use it as an insecticide on my garden as general insect killing is not my philosophy. However, it is a great flower and a very traditional member of an herb garden.
Raab, Piricicaba	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd. Named after the city in Brazil (pronounced peer-a-SEE-ca-ba) where there are beautiful waterfalls--and the university that depelved this heat-tolerant broccoli. Halfway between a standard grocery store broccoli and a broccoli raab, with large plants that produce lots of succulent small green heads. Heads, stalks and leaves are all sweet and tender. Good frost tolerance for fall sowing, but the thing that got our attention was its hot-weather performance in trials in California. It produced heads when temperatures were in the 90's.
Raab, Purple Peacock	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd. A differently unique type. Gorgeous ornamental edible with purple broccoli head, surrounded by leaves that look and taste much like Russian Red Kale, scalloped and cut with pink veination. After the main head is cut, treat it like raab or kale, cutting the shoots, leaves and stems to cook together.

Raab, Sessantina Grossa	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Raab, Sweet Spring	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd. Also called Rapini. An Italian heirloom, this is actually a type of turnip left in the ground until the following spring, when the shoots and flower stalks are harvested and eaten as a delicate broccoli.
Radicchio di Castelfranco	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Radicchio, Mix	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Radicchio, red preco	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Radicchio, Rossa di treviso precoce	vegetable / cold hardy	available starting April 22nd
Rampion	Herb	So tasty are the roots that there is a Grimm tale about the unfortunate child Rapunzel (German for 'rampion') who was given up to a witch after her father was caught stealing roots from the witch's garden. First year roots and tender basal leaves are edible. Blue bell-flowers in June or July.
Rhubarb - Victoria	perennial	A low-maintenance perennial with delicious tart stalks for pies and jams. Moisture and rich, well-drained soil. Deep-rooted, heavy feeder. Relatively low-acid. Caution: poisonous leaves--use leaf stems only.
Rosemary - BBQ	perennial herb	tender
Rosemary - Hill Hardy	perennial herb	The most hardy of rosemaries...
Rosemary officinalis 'arp'	perennial herb	tender
Rue - Ruta graveolens	perennial herb	I love the soft pea-like blue-green leaves. A fabulous scent. Black Swallowtail caterpillars like to eat this. The flowers are yellow in four pieces - cross-like. Very unusual. I do not recommend eating rue.
Rue, Syrian - Peganum harmala	perennial herb / dye plant	A very different plant from Common Rue - Source of the famous dye "Turkish Red", a characteristic colour of Persian carpets. In Egypt, the oil expressed from the seeds is said to be an aphrodisiac. Seeds possess hallucinogenic alkaloids.
Russian Sage - Perovskia atriplicifolia	perennial	pollinator friendly, silvery almost glowing airy stems and leaves topped with purple arches of flowers. Not a salvia.
Sage, (salvia) officinalis Berggarten (wide leaf)	perennial herb	pollinator friendly, my favorite thick leafed sage. "German" style sage - rounded leaves. Great fried. Even better fried with anchovy paste between two leaves!
Sage, (Salvia) Purple	perennial herb	pollinator friendly; "Italian" style sage -pointy, soft leaves. The purple is a beautiful contrast but the flavor is lacking a bit.
Sage, Cherry Chief (Salvia greggii 'Cherry Chief')	perennial herb	Outstanding ornamental from Mexico and Texas with small, fruit-scented leaves and wonderful bright coloured flowers. Called autumn sage because the hot days and cool nights of early fall bring on a glorious spurt of autumn flowers to cap off a continuous display that begins in June. The aromatic leaves are used as a seasoning in Mexico, and the edible nectar-filled flowers are excellent in salads, even adding to the 'crunch'! Magnet for hummingbirds. Does well in full or half sun. Many scarlet flowers, 2.5cm/1in. Does better than most during hot summer months.
Sage, Clary	perennial herb	an apothecary garden necessity.
Sage, common culinary (Italian-style)	perennial herb	pollinator friendly, very hardy. Great flavor.
Sage, Grape-Scented (Salvia melissodora)	perennial herb	(Tarahumara indian sage)Tender; Foliage is pleasantly aromatic but it is the lavender flowers that possess the remarkable grape scent. In bloom from late spring until frost, it is a perpetual magnet for bees, butterflies and hummingbirds. Ht. 1.5-2m/5-6ft.
Sage, Lowry's Peach (Salvia greggii 'Lowry's Peach')	perennial herb	Tender; this smells like Peach Snapps - overwinters with glory inside the house or greenhouse. Mine kept blooming all winter. Outstanding ornamentals from Mexico and Texas with small, fruit-scented leaves and wonderful bright coloured flowers. Called autumn sage because the hot days and cool nights of early fall bring on a glorious spurt of autumn flowers to cap off a continuous display that begins in June. The aromatic leaves are used as a seasoning in Mexico, and the edible nectar-filled flowers are excellent in salads, even adding to the 'crunch'! Magnet for hummingbirds. Does well in full or half sun.
Sage, Peruvian (Salvia discolor)	perennial herb	tender - a very strongly medicinal sage. Ceremonial. Scent is a rather pleasant complex of fruit, eucalyptus and resin. Striking deep purple flowers.
Sage, Pitcher	perennial herb	tender - a very strongly medicinal sage. Ceremonial.

Sage, Raspberry Royal (Salvia greggii 'Raspberry Royale')	perennial herb	Salvia collector Richard Dufresne discovered this growing in his sage garden. It turned out to be one of his best releases, dishing out an abundance of raspberry-purple colour spring, summer and fall. Ht. 30-45 cm (12-18 in).
Sage, Tibetan	perennial herb	tender - a very strongly medicinal sage. Ceremonial. (Gansu danshen) Native to the high mountains of Western China and Tibet where it grows along the edges of forests, streams and ditches. It is a beautiful species with strongly aromatic grey-green foliage and purple-red flowers arranged in spikes rising up to 60cm/2ft. The root is used like Chinese red sage or danshen to treat heart conditions and to prevent heart disease. Its effect on the heart is probably related to its proven ability to prevent blood clots.
Sage, White (Salvia Apiana)	perennial herb	tender - a very strongly medicinal sage. Ceremonial. Indigenous sage used ceremonially by native people, tied into bundles and burned as incense "smudge sticks". Likes a well-drained, dry, sunny spot. Perennial in zones 7 and above, grown as annual where winters are cold. Gray-white foliage and white or pale blue flowers.
Sage, White Dalmation (Salvia officinalis 'White Dalmation')	perennial herb	for many, this is the top culinary sage. I love to throw a leaf or two with green beans as they steam. A little sea salt, and it is a breathtaking dish! A superior selection for commercial field production. Has a very desirable clean aroma and flavour, with little of the bitterness found in other sage varieties. If you have turned your nose up to sage in the past, this cultivar may change your mind. Tomato, Goldie	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Low-Acid Tomato. Large, dense, full flavored orange-juice colored tomatoes with low acidity. Dates back to 1870s.
Tomato, Grape	vegetable, Warm weather	available starting May 13th; Long, grape-like clusters of brilliant red elongated cherry tomatoes have earned this variety its name. Yarrow (white medicinal)	perennial herb	Ancient healing herb, used by many cultures worldwide for stopping headaches, colds, and flu. A handful of leaves in the bath soaks out aches and pains. Excellent butterfly and beneficial insect plant, with big flat clusters of small flowers--the shape butterflies prefer for landing and nectar-gathering. Forms a mat of roots and lacy leaves that holds soil and allows moisture to penetrate; good for sloped beds and edges of perennial plantings. Also makes a good low soil-holding understory for spring bulbs, before the yarrow sends up flowerstalks.
